

Admission, Parking, and Shuttle Information

Due to the generosity of our sponsors, there will not be an admission charge to get into the Balloon Fest. Donations are greatly appreciated and can be made at various locations throughout the Balloon Fest grounds.

There will be a \$5 per car parking fee at all of the parking locations. This fee applies each time you enter a parking area - if you leave and come back, you need to pay an additional \$5 for parking on your return visit. Please have cash ready for the volunteers at each location to aid in the smooth transition from the main streets to the parking areas.

There will be five parking locations in the vicinity of the festival field. Three of these locations will be on the East side of Antioch just North of the event in the portion of the field not used for the Balloon Fest. Another location will be on the West side of Antioch, just South of Blue Valley West High School. The fifth location will be on the Northeast corner of 157th and Antioch at Grace Church.

Each area will have its own entrance. Overland Park Police Officers will be directing traffic to these entrances and there will be volunteers to collect the parking fee and help direct parking on the fields.

To help you locate your vehicle when you are ready to depart, there will be colored flags marking the ends of the rows of cars. Please note the color of the flag at the end of your row when you park your car.

Additional satellite parking will be available at South Creek Office Park (located at 132nd Street and Metcalf Avenue). There will be volunteers at this location to assist with parking and shuttle information.



Admission, Parking, and Shuttle Information

Shuttles, some of which are equipped for handicap accessibility, will be running to/from the South Creek parking area every 20 to 30 minutes. **Important note:** the shuttles will be picking up patrons in the bank parking lot at the entrance to the South Creek Office Park.

We highly recommend that any guests who need additional assistance (strollers, wheelchairs, etc.) use the satellite parking at South Creek. This will help you avoid traffic and pedestrian congestion on 159th, 167th, and Antioch and will provide paved parking for easier loading and unloading of your vehicle.

If you prefer to drop your passengers off at the event entrance, this can be done in the Northbound lane of Antioch between 167th Street and 162nd Street. Please remember that there will be a lot of traffic. We will be working with the Overland Park Police Department in an effort to keep vehicles moving and pedestrians safe, but we are counting on you to be aware of pedestrians and other vehicles and to be respectful of the officers that are assisting us.

Reminder to all of our guests:

This event is being held on a farmed field and the terrain is uneven. Please keep that in mind and be careful as you move around the event grounds.

Frequently Asked Questions

WHEN SHOULD I ARRIVE AT THE BALLOON FEST?

Hot air balloons fly in the early morning and evening, weather permitting. Since we are anticipating a large crowd for the weekend, arriving early for a morning launch - around 6 a.m. is advisable. Peak times are Friday night and Saturday night. The evening launches are scheduled for 5:30 p.m. with balloon glows both nights at 8:00. You should arrive at the field no later than 4 p.m. to view the evening balloon activities. If you stay on-site during the day to enjoy the activities, listen to great bands, eat the terrific food, and sit back in your lawn chair or on your blanket, you can avoid the cost of coming back and paying an additional parking fee.

WHERE DO WE WATCH THE BALLOONS?

There will be plenty of space around and on the balloon field for you to watch as the balloons are inflated, take off, and the pilots compete in the various events. One word of warning: the burners are very loud and may frighten some guests. Please keep this in mind when you are choosing a spot to enjoy the action.

WILL WE BE ABLE TO RIDE IN A BALLOON AT THE EVENT?

Pets are not allowed unless they are ADA service animals.

ARE LARGE PACKAGES AND BACKPACKS ALLOWED AT THE BALLOON FEST?

While backpacks and large packages are allowed, **coolers are not**, and all packages may be subject to inspection upon entering the Balloon Fest grounds.

IS THE EVENT HANDICAP ACCESSIBLE?

While we have handicap parking available at our satellite parking location and some handicap accessible shuttles, the event is being held on an undeveloped field and the terrain is rough.

IS SMOKING ALLOWED AT THE BALLOON FEST?

No smoking is allowed on or around the launch field at any time during the event.

IS THERE ANY AVAILABLE SEATING AT THE EVENT?

There will be very limited seating available at the event. We encourage you to bring lawn chairs and/or picnic blankets.

WILL THERE BE WATER FOUNTAINS AT THE EVENT?

No, but the vendors will be selling bottled water.

HOW MUCH CASH SHOULD I BRING TO THE EVENT?

Parking will be \$5 per vehicle. There will be food and art vendors in addition to event souvenirs. These vendors will only take cash at the event. All of the children's activities will be available free of charge.

WILL THERE BE SOUVENIRS AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE AT THE BALLOON FEST?

Yes! Souvenirs are not available for purchase online this year, but there will be a booth at the event with hats, pins, shirts, bags, glow-in-the-dark accessories, and event posters.

WHERE CAN I STAY IF I AM COMING TO THE BALLOON FEST FROM OUT OF TOWN?

The Overland Park Marriott is the official headquarters hotel of the Balloon Fest. If the Marriott is full or you prefer another hotel, there are other hotels listed on the Overland Park Convention and Visitors Bureau Site.

WHERE CAN I LEARN MORE ABOUT THE CITY OF OVERLAND PARK AND THE OVERLAND PARK CONVENTION AND VISITORS BUREAU?

WHEN IS THE BEST TIME TO TAKE A PICTURE?

The twilight hours provide a warm contrast between the glow of the balloon and the sky. Make sure that you are using high speed film or the appropriate setting on your digital camera.

WHAT IS THE BEST WAY TO TAKE A PICTURE?

Close-up pictures show fun and interesting details and provide uncluttered views. It is also a good idea to take an overall shot to provide context for your closer pictures.

WHAT IS A BALLOON GLOW?

A balloon glow is an on-ground display of the balloons after sunset. The flames from the burners cause the balloons to glow, creating an amazing show for spectators. Spectators may enter the balloon field to walk around the balloons and talk to the pilots.

WHAT DO CHASE CREWS DO?

A chase crew is the group of people who help the pilot inflate and deflate his/her balloon for each flight. This involves helping to unpack and spread the balloon on the ground,

following, or chasing, the balloon during its flight, and then folding and packing the balloon back up.

WHAT TYPES OF COMPETITIONS DO THE PILOTS COMPETE IN AT THE BALLOON FEST?

The pilots will compete in a Pole Grab, a Multiple Judge-Declared Goal, a Fly-In Task, and a Minimum Double Drop. All competitions are based on accuracy, not speed.

WHERE DO THE BALLOONS LAND?

The balloon pilots will land their balloons in open areas that appear to have good access for their chase crew. Unless it is absolutely necessary, the pilots will not land in a field where there is livestock. However, in the event that the pilot finds it necessary to do so, he/she will always try to turn the burners off quickly in an effort to keep from scaring the animals. Most pilots find that the livestock is curious about the balloon after it lands and come over to check it out.

IF I LIVE AROUND THE AREA OF THE BALLOON FEST, CAN I HAVE A BALLOON LAND ON MY STREET OR ON MY PROPERTY?

Absolutely! If you are interested in having a hot air balloon land on or near your property, spread a white sheet out where you would like the balloon to land. Good places for a landing are away from power lines and don't have any obstacles for at least 60' in all directions. Cul-de-sacs in neighborhoods with underground power lines work well as landing areas.




